Background : Sadhana Institute for Sustainable Development Pune is a registered non-government organization working for more than twenty years to empower women & Children at the grassroots communities in Maharashtra. As part of the women's empowerment program the organization in collaboration with MASHAL Pune implemented the Tailoring Centre for women under Livelihood Skilling Program.

Introduction to the project: The project Tailoring under Livelihood Skilling Program for women is planned to implement in the vicinity of slum areas which are located 23 km from Pune city towards Pune Mumbai highway at Dehuroad Pune. It is planned to train one batch of 30 women from underprivileged communities in the trade of tailoring.

Introduction to the project area: The project is been implemented in the communities of Dehuroad cantonment Pune. Dehuroad is one the oldest cantonment established in the British era in 1940 & governed through the Cantonment Board Act of 1921 & now Amended as the Cantonment Board Act 2006 as local self-government which is unlike other governance like Municipal corporation or Zilha Parishad. Since the cantonment boards are directly affiliated with the defence Ministry which was considered in the nonplan sector nationally does not receive any space in the planned sector. Hence the government schemes planned under five-year plans never reached these areas. Even today we do not see any of the schemes for people's development accept basic formal education up to xth Std & ICDS from 2012 that were too established because of the advocacy initiative of the sadhana Institute. No of the schemes is implemented by the cantonment board for the development of women & girls. Hence this project is very strong support to the women of the project area.

Introduction to the Course: The organization has developed a three-month basic Course in tailoring that empower women right from handling machine to cutting, Stitching, and enhancing skills through creating livelihoods.

Activities Done :

Deployment of human resources: Two human resources were recruited to work specifically for the project.

1. Project coordinator - Mrs. Saroja Prasad who has long experience of community development and mobilization.
2. Master (Trainer). – Aziz Sheikh an expert in training & stitching ladies clothes from traditional to modern designs.

Identification of the beneficiaries: The coordinator did home visits in different communities and identified the women who are interested in learning the tailoring trade and enhancing their skills in establishing livelihoods. The coordinator identified 35 women from communities mainly from Shivajinagar, Gandhinagar, Rajiv Gandhinagar & bazaar area. All these area are the slums in the Dehuroad cantonment. During selection mainly three criteria were considered ie. 1. They are local residents 2. Interest in regular learning 3. Not taken training earlier from any institute.

The beneficiaries Identified are mainly from underprivileged communities with low socio-economic status.

Women's meeting

Women who have been identified were called for a meeting for the orientation of the tailoring training program and were discussed about the activities and products and those women wish to learn. Through the meeting they were also encouraged to be regular in the training and how they can enhance their skills and create income source for themselves and their families. In the meeting the daily practice of the training were also discussed.

Training course



The training were plan in two batches 15 in each batch so that every student gets sufficient time for their practice. One batch from 12 to 2.00 Pm and the second from 2.00 pm to 4.00 Pm.

The training started with making an understanding of the machine. Its different parts, fixing of needle & thread, cleaning, and maintenance. Initial two days they were just made comfortable to run the machine on simple clothes so that they are able to fix up their movements through their hand and legs on the machine holding the clothes to make stitches. Later on they were taught how to take measurements, mark, and cutting of different products. Of course, it started on paper and then on clothes with basic small products to other products like frock, blouse, and dress as it has huge demand in the market.

Case Study

Sharmila found a new way of earning her livelihood..

Background -

A young lady Sharmila of age 34 years got married with Nitin Gohar in the year 2005, and living in Shivaji nagar Dehuroad with her husband and three children Karansingh age 15, Prachi age 11, and Thavannit singh of 8 years since last 09 years on rental basis. As she belongs to walmiki community in which no women allowed to go outside the house Their Community customs keep women always in ghoongat, not to come in front of other male without parada / ghoongat. Her husband was working in marketing and getting monthly salary of Rs. 15000/-, but during Covid 19 pandemic he lost his job and problems arises how to survive our family and fulfil their daily life needs. Without their own wish he has started plumbing work and getting monthly Rs. 8000/-, now somehow try to maintaining their family needs.



Sharmila Joined in Skill Development Training Program -

She want to contribute in her family income by doing some work at home so that she can also take care of her children. When she heard about Sadhana Tailoring Basic Course through the coordinator, she joined in Livelihood Skill development training program. In this program she learned to stich basic clothes that they use. She has learned to make small frocks, body petticoat, sari petticoat, blouse and salwar kurta. She says at least now I can save money which I had to pay for stitching clothes for herself & her children. She thrives to learn more to work as professional tailor and earn good money. Through this she is happy that she can do some kind of work that could give livelihood opportunity.

Impact -

She feels good that now she learned a new way of earning money and contribute for her family's growth.
