

1) PMAY Housing Survey– Jejuri (2018-2019)

Jejuri Municipal Council, with population of about 15 thousand is Purandhar sub district's the least populous municipal council located in Purandhar sub district of Pune district in the state Maharashtra in India. Total geographical area of Jejuri municipal council is 7 km² and it is the smallest city by area in the sub district. Jejuri Temple is located in the Jejuri town, which lies to the southeast of the Pune city of Maharashtra.

Jejuri is a Municipal Council city in district of Pune, Maharashtra. The Jejuri city is divided into 8 wards for which elections are held every 5 years. The Jejuri town has population of 14,515 among them 7347 (51%) are male and 7168 (49%) are female. 85% of the whole population are from general caste, 13% are from schedule caste and 2% are schedule tribes. Child (aged under 6 years) population of Jejuri municipal council is 11%, among them 52% are boys and 48% are girls. There are 3286 households in the city and an average 4 persons live in every family. As per report released by Census India 2011.

Mashal has surveyed in Jejuri Municipal council that time found that, in Jejuri there is no declared slum area. But people from low-income group live in slum like area in Jejuri but Jejuri Municipal Council has 8 Slum Pockets. Also, Mashal has prepared the Housing for All Plan of Action for Jejuri Municipal Council under PMAY scheme.

2) PMAY Housing Survey– Arvi Municipal Council (2017-2018)

Arvi is located at a distance of 57 kms from Wardha district. Arvi is an important centre for the cotton and soybean trade. The closest airport from Arvi is Nagpur Airport situated at 100 kilometres and the closest Railway Station from Arvi is Pulgoan Junction situated at 35 kilometres. The location of Arvi is on Ravandev Garmasur Plateau, which is also a reason for the growth of long thread bearing cotton. Wardha river and Bakli river flowing alongside the borders of Arvi taluka are the main source of water for the villages. Arvi is also called the City of Saints. Saint Maybe, Saint Pandurang Maharaj, Saint Lahanuji Maharaj (Takarkheda) are the prominent ones having their own followers spread across the Vidarbha region.

As of 2011 India census, Arvi had a population of 42,822: 21,956 males (51%) and 20,864 females (49%). There are 5,836 members of Scheduled Castes and 2,123 of Scheduled Tribes. Arvi has a literacy rate of 90.6%, higher than the national

average. Many educationists have contributed to this literacy rate and Arvi follows the progressive thinking for which Maharashtra is known for in India.

In the principal object of planning is to provide the socioeconomic facilities and zoning for the existing and anticipated population of the town. In the development plan the socioeconomic facilities are provide for the projected population by the year 2025and the areas of the zoning are provided for the projected population by the year 2025. However, it is noted that no land is provided in the development plan for affordable housing. Mashal has prepared DPR for Arvi Municipal council.
